

Demographics


Student Population Percentages by Ethnic Subgroups


RCPS District Enrollment 2011 - 2017

4 Year Cohort Graduation Rate





have been purchased with E-SPLOST IV funds and distributed to students and teachers.







Rockdale Magnet School Math Team placed 2nd out of 35 schools at the state-wide Mercer University High School Mathematics Contest on Nov. 12th. Matthew York paced 1st and Andrew Bonar placed 3rd in ciphering.

Congressional App Challenge Winners for Congressman Hank Johnson's district - Rockdale Magnet students Austin Goodloe (10th gr), Jeebe Diop, Daniel Garner, Brandon Golston (11th gr) won with "Dungeon Delver II" game app. Congressman Johnson recognized these students on Jan. 17th at Rockdale Magnet School.

Coca-Cola Scholar Semifinalist - Rockdale Magnet School senior Jazz Duncan selected as a semi-finalist for the Coca-Cola Scholars Program. About 1,900 seniors named semi-finalists from more than 86,000 applicants. 150 college scholarships worth \$20,000 each are awarded. Students are selected to advance to this next phase based on academic excellence, leadership and service demonstrated in school and community activities.

Junior Science and Humanities Symposium on February 26-28, 2017 at UGA - 26 students from RCPS chosen to present with only 70 spots available statewide. 23 Rockdale Magnet students and three Davis Middle Students participated. The DMS students are the only middle school students selected.

State Science Fair - 16 middle school students (12 projects) and 29 high school students (28 projects) were selected from Rockdale Regional Science and Engineering Fair to present at the 2017 Georgia Science and Engineering Fair.

National and International Science Fair Award Winners - Five Rockdale Magnet students were National Consortium of Secondary STEM Schools Student Research Conference Representatives, June 2017, in Boston, MA. One Rockdale Magnet student selected as International Sustainable World Project Olympiad Representative, held May 2017, Houston, TX. International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF) presenters and awards: Madeline Burkey "The Effect of EDTA Chelation as a Desorption Mechanism" 11th grade at Rockdale Magnet; Nkima Stephenson "Data Integration & Analysis of Epigenetics" Kardinal Award Winner - Best in Fair, 12th grade at Rockdale Magnet; and Michelle Nguyen "Topical Antibiotics Consisting of Iron Oxide Nanoparticles" 11th grade at Rockdale Magnet.



Rockdale Magnet School Math Team placed 2nd at the 43rd annual Georgia Southwestern State University High School Mathematics Tournament. 330 students participated from 38 schools. Magnet students Raeed Ahmed, Sarah Beharry, Andrew Bonar, Elijah Cheban, Erin Hardnett, Felix Luu, Zarek Syed, and Matthew York were coached by Dr. Charles Garner. Andrew Bonar won 1st place in individual honors and Matthew York won 5th place in individual honors.

Governor's Honors Program (GHP) is a residential summer program for gifted and talented high school juniors and seniors. Approximately 3,000 students from across the state applied to attend the program, and those students underwent a rigorous selection process to be named semi-finalists. 18 RCPS high school students advanced as semi-finalists. HHS – 9; RCHS – 8; SHS - 1. These students interviewed and auditioned in February. Four RCPS students are among the 600 selected for the program held at Berry College summer 2017— Zoe Chichester from Heritage High - Dance; Ryan Valley from Heritage High - Vocal Music; Cameron Bennett from RCHS/Magnet - Engineering; Zarek Syed – RCHS/Magnet - Mathematics.



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
